

**Welcome to Lutheran Church of the Reformation!** For 153 years, Reformation has enjoyed a unique location near the nation's Capitol. Reformation has long been involved in social justice and helping organizations throughout the D.C. area, including Southeast Ministry. We have equipped 96 apartments for refugees over the past few years. Since 1987, we have belonged to ReconcilingWorks, a national Lutheran LGBTQ+ ministry. We honor the Nacotchtank and Piscataway peoples upon whose land we live and worship.

All children receive an age appropriate Bible to take home!

**An all-gender/handicapped accessible restroom** is on the sanctuary level, on the right front of the sanctuary near the elevator.

*Timothy is reminded of the confession he made at his baptism and of its implications for daily life. His priorities will be different from those of people who merely want to be rich.*

<sup>6</sup>Of course, there is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; <sup>7</sup>for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; <sup>8</sup>but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. <sup>9</sup>But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. <sup>10</sup>For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

<sup>11</sup>But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. <sup>12</sup>Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. <sup>13</sup>In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus,

who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you <sup>14</sup>to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>15</sup>which he will bring about at the right time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. <sup>16</sup>It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen.

<sup>17</sup>As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. <sup>18</sup>They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, <sup>19</sup>thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

### Gospel

Luke 16:19-31

*Jesus tells a parable in which the poor one is “lifted up” and the rich one is “sent away empty.” Jesus makes it clear that this ethic of merciful reversal is not new but is as old as Moses and the prophets.*

The Holy Gospel according to Luke.

**Glory to you, O Lord.**

Jesus said: <sup>19</sup>“There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. <sup>20</sup>And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, <sup>21</sup>who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man’s table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. <sup>22</sup>The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. <sup>23</sup>In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by

his side. <sup>24</sup>He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.' <sup>25</sup>But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. <sup>26</sup>Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' <sup>27</sup>He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house—<sup>28</sup>for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' <sup>29</sup>Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' <sup>30</sup>He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' <sup>31</sup>He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.' "

## **\*REFORMATION HAPPENINGS\***

**Dr. Neal Davidson** is a life-long Lutheran and a member of the Metro DC Synod. He graduated from Iowa State University, Central Lutheran Theological Seminary, received a ThM from Princeton and a PhD from Columbia University, New York. He began his ministry as a Parish Developer, served 32 years as a military chaplain and since 1996 has been an intentional Interim Pastor. Additionally, for 31 years, he has been an Adjunct Professor for Central Michigan University and 6 years as a Communication Trainer for the Ford Motor Company. Next year, in May, he will celebrate the 60th anniversary of his ordination. He lives in Falls Church, VA.

**Nursery and Sunday School classes have begun!** The nursery is open; however, with only one licensed child care provider, we will limit the number of children to 5 at a time and they must be under 4 years old. Sunday School for ages 4-12 years old, in age groups, has begun as well!

**Support Puerto Rico.** The people of Puerto Rico have asked for donations to be given directly to local organizations instead of government sources or corporations. Below are local non-profit organizations that would welcome donations due to Hurricane Fiona. Links are in the Weekly Word email.

- Brigada Solidaria Del Oeste (work to promote the development of our communities through mutual support, art, music, and activism)
- Global Giving (help first responders meet survivors' immediate needs for food, fuel, clean water, hygiene products, and shelter. Then, this fund will transition to support longer-term recovery efforts run by local, vetted local organizations)
- Mi Patria (working with the municipalities of Isabela and Aguadilla)
- Comedore Sociales (Soup Kitchen)
- Taller Salud (Women -led nonprofit that leads in the comprehensive reconstruction of their communities after Hurricane Maria 5 years ago)
- Ayuda Legal Puerto Rico (non-profit organization that provides free and accessible legal education and support to individuals and communities with a vision of legal empowerment. Our projects address issues of access to justice, right to housing, climate justice and fair recovery)
- Fundacion Pisadas de Amor (non-profit aimed at improving the quality of life of our older adults and families, transforming their homes into decent places to live)
- PRxPR Relief and Rebuild Fund (launched in the wake of Hurricane Maria by Puerto Rican business leaders in the U.S. and works with local organizations across the island to help rebuild infrastructure and provide disaster relief)
- World Central Kitchen
- Global Empowerment Mission (based in Miami; provide grassroots efforts with a large institutional impact for the most vulnerable populations affected by disasters around the world)

**Jackson, MS Water Crisis.** A citywide water system emergency has been declared in Jackson, Mississippi as a result of the city's aging, fragile infrastructure. About 82 percent of the residents are Black, highlighting how this water crisis is an issue of environmental injustice. Google these organizations to donate:

- *The Mississippi Food Network* has partnered with a local television station to raise funds to purchase water. According to the website, a \$15 donation can provide three cases of water.
- *Mississippi Rapid Response Coalition – Water Fund*, a group of over 30 Mississippi-based nonprofits, has a goal of raising at least 2 million dollars to provide clean water to residents. You may also volunteer by emailing [rapidresponse@peoplesadvocacyinstitute.com](mailto:rapidresponse@peoplesadvocacyinstitute.com).
- *New Horizon Ministries* accepts donations online, and regularly distributes food and water to

Jackson residents in need.

- *Immigrant Alliance for Justice and Equity* has been staging water giveaways and is raising funds.
- *Cooperation Jackson* is “engaging in an autonomous relief effort to ensure that the homeless, the elderly, and those with limited transportation in our community get the resources they need.”
- *Mississippi M.O.V.E.* is working with the Mississippi Rapid Response Coalition in response to the water crisis.

**DC’s Zero Waste Plan.** Stewardship opportunities through helping develop DC's Zero Waste Plan continue! Now until October 7th, residents, businesses, stakeholders, and community leaders across the District of Columbia will all have a formal opportunity to submit public comments in response to the ZeroWaste DC Plan’s draft framework comprised of 7 overarching Goals and 53 proposed Actions. The draft framework is a result of years of research and development but was greatly influenced by the 10 community engagement events hosted from August 1st to August 12th of this year.
