Helen Anne Vigness

Helen was born on April 20, 1923 in St. Paul, Minnesota to Joseph A. Vigness and Anne Frenning Vigness. Beloved aunt of Margaret (Ray) Chicca and Paul (Faye) Harris, great aunt to Jennifer (Ronnie) Sites and Kirsten (Frank) Schmidt, and great great aunt to Brody, Blake, and Brynlee Sites; Tanner, and Quinn Schmidt. Helen is predeceased by her sister Jane V. Harris.

The Vigness family moved from Minnesota to the Washington, DC area in 1936. Helen attended McKinley Tech High School class of 1941, then attended George Washington University: BA in 1951 and MA in 1956 at night school. Helen started her career with the Central Intelligence Agency in 1947 and retired in 1979, becoming the first female analyst during her career. Helen was an avid traveler, visiting all the continents including Antarctica. Helen was a member of the Norwegian society, Fairland pool water aerobics, and the Silver Spring Recorder Club.
